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Introduction

This brief is designed to provide some contextual information about the operation of the
water industry to parties of the Government Inquiry into the Havelock North Drinking Water
Inquiry. It details some of the activities of Water New Zealand as the representative body for
the industry, the extent of engagement by Councils in New Zealand with Water New Zealand
and the extent of involvement of staff at Hastings District Council with various groups which
the Association operates.

The Water Industry

- 2. The responsibility for the provision of water supply in urban environments in New Zealand lies with Territorial Local Authorities district and city councils, or with a Council Controlled Organisation. (Section 124 of the Local Government act)
- 3. The reticulation of public water supplies is different to other utilities provision in several respects. Firstly, its provision is disaggregated in the sense that it is supplied by 67 different Councils. Unlike electricity, telephones and roads which form joined up national networks often supplied by a limited number of organisations, water supply is supplied separately by each individual council.
- 4. Additionally, every individual community within each Council District boundary is often supplied from a separate water source or sources. That is, virtually all towns in New Zealand have their own dedicated water supply, typically unconnected to the supply in each adjacent town. However there are some small communities where their water supply is interconnected.
- 5. Virtually all Councils or Council Controlled Organisations employ someone who fulfils the function of overseeing the supply of drinking water in their district colloquially referred as the Water Services Manager. If a Council does not employ someone directly then they have an external service provider who does so for them. This provision may be by way of service contracts with a private sector provider such as, for example: Veolia, Downers or Citycare.
- 6. Every Council either employs directly, or retains the services of an external service provider to provide advice as to the design, operation and maintenance of water treatment plants and pipeline networks for each individual water supply which the Council operates.
- 7. All decisions on what type of water treatment plant and pipeline reticulation network to install is made separately by each individual council. While there are a range of accepted technology for water treatment adopted by the industry there is nothing to prevent a Council installing innovative technology.
- 8. All funding decisions as to capital expenditure and maintenance of networks are made separately by each individual Council usually based on Activity Management Planning.
- 9. All decisions about whether to treat public water supplies lies with the elected Councillors in each Council, with advice from the Water Service Manager.
- 10. It is probably correct to claim that most if not all water supplies drawn from surface water sources are treated in some manner. It is probably also correct to claim that many water supplies which use secure bore water are untreated. This provides no barrier to the risk of contamination post abstraction.

The Association

- 11. Water New Zealand is the principal trade association which represents the interests of the water industry. Water in this context includes drinking water, waste water and stormwater. It is important to realise that participation in the activities of the Association is voluntary. We have no statutory powers.
- 12. Our membership includes most District and City Councils in New Zealand, and most regional Councils. Those Council members and non-members are detailed in **Appendix 1**. Our membership also includes most of the professional consultancy companies providing advisory services to Councils, and most of the suppliers of goods and services to the sector. As at the time of writing the Association had 1600 financial members, both corporate and individual.
- 13. As such we consider we have a mandate to speak on behalf of the water reticulation industry.
- 14. The Association is funded exclusively from the financial contribution of its members and the services it provides, and does not receive any central Government funding.
- 15. The Association provides services to the industry in three main ways: industry collaboration, advocacy on behalf of the sector, and the provision of technical guidance.

Industry Collaboration

- 16. There are a variety of ways in which Association members can participate in industry activities.
- 17. The Association runs two main conferences, one focussed on drinking water and waste water which usually has 1000+ registrants and 175 trade exhibitors, and a smaller conference focussed on stormwater which usually has 330 registrants and 25 trade exhibitors. **Appendix 2** shows participation by District and Regional Councils over the past 5 years and the extent of participation of Hastings District Council staff.
- 18. We have a number of regular meetings of industry participants, the most significant of which is a twice annual meeting of the Water Service Managers Group representatives of each Council where water related issues are discussed. **Appendix 3** shows participation by Councils over the past 5 years. Brett Chapman and Dylan Stuijt from Hastings District Council have been members of WSMG since 2001 and 2006 respectively.
- 19. The Association co-ordinates a number of *special interest groups*. Participation in these is by self-selection. **Appendix 4** provides a list of these groups, the number of industry participants in each group, and the number of groups which Hastings District Council staff participates in.

Advocacy

- 20. The Association acts as a spokesperson for the water industry. We produce the Water Journal 5 times a year a professional publication which contains news and technical updates on the sector. We produce a fortnightly newsletter (Pipeline) for members and interested parties.
- 21. We provide the following services on behalf of our members: timely media commentary; submissions to government on discussion documents, regulatory and legislative changes;

appear before Parliamentary Select Committees, and represent the industry at a wide variety of industry and government related fora.

Technical Guidance

- 22. The Association employs two full time technical staff and co-ordinates the provision of technical guides to the sector. The Association has produced a number of guidance documents for use by Councils. These include:
 - New Zealand Pipe Inspection Manual 2006 Currently under review
 - Water loss guidelines and the associated software tool (2010)
 - Onsite wastewater system maintenance guideline for home owners
 - Draft National Modelling Guideline Wastewater Modelling (2009)
 - Draft National Modelling Guideline Water Distribution Network Modelling (2009)
 - New Zealand Constructed Wetland Planting Guidelines (2006)
 - Oxidation Pond Guidelines (2005) Currently under review
 - Application of Bio solids to Land in New Zealand (2003) Currently under review
 - National Guideline for Occupational Health and Safety in the New Zealand Water Industry (2001) Currently under review
 - New Zealand Infrastructure Asset Grading Guidelines (1999)
 - Infiltration and Inflow Control Manual (2015)
 - Visual Assessment Manual for Utility Asset (2008)
 - New Zealand Asbestos Cement Water main manual (2001) Currently under review
 - Manual for Wastewater Odour Management
- 23. Of particular relevance to the supply of public drinking water are several documents currently under review. The first of these is a review of our asbestos cement water mains database, manual and life prediction model. The database contains test data on asbestos cement pipes around New Zealand and is used as the basis of lifetime prediction and analysis curves. The accompanying manual provides specifications for sampling, testing and condition grading. Information in the manual and database is being updated and expanded to include contemporary information and improve usability.
- 24. We have just completed a review of four good practice guides for the supply of water treatment chemicals. In 2016 revisions were incorporated into good practice guidelines for the supply of Chlorine, Aluminium Sulphate, Hydrated Lime, and Polyelectrolyte. Ministry of Health is undertaking further work to determine chlorate levels in Drinking Water Supplies. This work will be completed and incorporated into a chlorine guidance document in 2018. The chlorine guideline has been provided as provisional advice until this amendment. The guidelines provide purchasers, manufacturers, and suppliers with the minimum physical, chemical and testing requirements for drinking water chemicals to meet safe limits.
- 25. We are currently producing a guide to the development of chlorine emergency management plans. This project will provide good practice guidance on the development of Chlorine Emergency Response Plans for water treatment plants, wastewater treatment plants and swimming pools.
- 26. The Association also produces an annual National Performance Review. This is an exercise to benchmark the performance of Councils in the delivery of services. Attached as **Appendix 5**

- is a list of participation by Councils since the survey began in 2008. 2016 is the first year in which Hastings District Council has participated.
- 27. All of these guidance documents and best practice guides are produced for the water industry with active participation and input from Association staff, Council staff and consulting engineering firms.
- 28. While this documentation is provided free of charge to Councils, there is no legal obligation for councils to use or adhere to any of this guidance material. The Association has no ability to require Councils to either contribute financially in the development of this material or require its use in day to day operations.

Hastings District Council Participation in Water NZ Activities

29. This brief report has demonstrated a pattern of ongoing engagement by Mr Chapman and Mr Stuijt from Hastings District Council in the wider activities of the water industry as coordinated by Water New Zealand over the past 15 years.
