





# Safe Drinking-water Supplies: Understanding your Risks and Responsibilities

Water New Zealand and the Society of Local Government Managers invite you to a two hour session on the risks and responsibilities of safe drinking-water supplies.

Responsibility for drinking-water rests on many shoulders. A failure at any point can have dire consequences. This session is designed to assist those involved in the supply chain to understand their risks and responsibilities.

#### Who should attend?

Anyone with a role in ensuring safe drinking-water supplies, including councillors, council staff, district health and district health board officials.

#### What will be covered?

- The evolution of safe water supplies, including the history of water-borne disease and public water works.
- Which water-borne contaminants make people sick, an introduction to microbiological, chemical and physical drinking-water contaminants.
- Consideration of serious first world water-borne illness outbreaks, covering outbreaks such as Milwaukee, Walkerton, Darfield and how they have changed our thinking.
- Water treatment technologies, explained in simple terms.
- The Governments compliance tools and what are they trying to achieve; The Health (Drinking Water) Amendment Act 2007 and the Drinking Water Standards for New Zealand 2005 (R2008).
- Managing risk in drinking-water supplies, ideas and concepts behind risk management.
- · What responsibilities exist in the supply of safe drinking-water
