Pre- Forum Tours, Wed 25th October 2023

Expressions of Interest are invited for the Tours but will be subject to confirmation once numbers and logistics are determined.

Option 1: CentrePort (Expected duration up to 2.5 hours)

CentrePort will host a tour of port facilities including a briefing on current and planned activities. Topics will cover; navigating a large insurance claim for infrastructure, large-scale master-planning, recovery work and the Inter-Island Terminal.

Option 2: National Crisis Management Centre (Expected Duration 1 hour)

Note: with this tour there may be a series of staggered start times through the afternoon to limit numbers on each tour to approximately 15. The NCMC is located in the basement of the Beehive within the Parliamentary precinct. Access will be via the main security entrance at the front of Parliament Buildings.

The National Crisis Management Centre (NCMC) facilitates the Central Government crisis management arrangements and offers interagency and scalable operability to deal with any type of emergency. The NCMC is managed and maintained in a continued state of readiness by the National Emergency Management Agency.

The NCMC's design is aimed at maximum selfsustainability in the event of a major Wellington earthquake or other local disasters and service failures. The tour of the facilities will highlight how this is achieved.

Aim: To connect emerging professionals with established practitioners.

Objectives:

- Inform government and industry practitioners of emerging research and professionals' work.
- Provide an opportunity for practitioners working in the field of disaster risk reduction to get to know and develop a relationship with emerging talent.

Format: 5-minute presentations.

- Maximum 5-minute talk.
- The session will last for no longer than 30 minutes, with an aim of 5 presentations.

Suggested elevator pitch presentation content:

- Your background (where and what degree did you study for your undergraduate degree/where and what degree are you studying for now/where and what are you working on now?)
- Your broad Lifelines interests/How did you become interested in Lifelines?
- Your current research/work topic (Think about how this will be useful to the attendees and will be usable in practice).
- Highlights from your studies. E.g. big conferences, successful experiments, press interest in your research.
- Future career aspirations. What would you like to do next? What are your career interests?

Submission criteria and benefits:

- Presenters are to be current students or early career (up to three years post-studies).
- Video of draft presentation to be submitted by 30th August, 2023.
- Free conference registration, if accepted to present.
